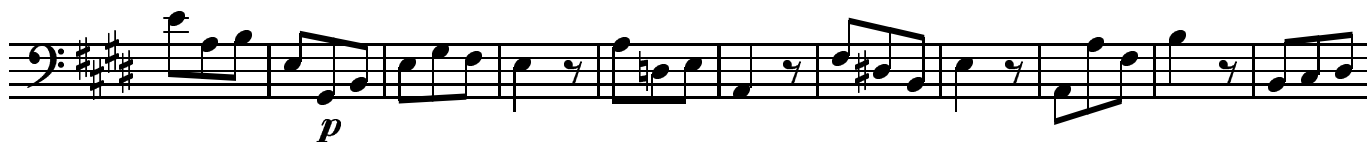
ADAGIO
